- A Message from Pastor Trish -

50 Years! It's time to celebrate Messiah's 50th anniversary, and we will do so on July 31st. Look for all the details elsewhere in the newsletter, and make plans to join us.

Like any organization, Messiah has lots of stories from the last 50 years. Some are celebratory, some heartwarming, some painful or difficult. (Sounds like life in general, doesn't it?) It's been a privilege to hear many of these stories in the time that I've been your called pastor, and a privilege to be a part of the stories we've made from the last few years. Stories help us learn from and remember our past, and they are also a part of shaping the stories of our future. Let me explain.

In his book "Canoeing the Mountains: Christian Leadership in Uncharted Territory", Todd Bolsinger tells the story of Lewis and Clark. As we know, they set out to explore the Missouri River, hoping to find a water route that would connect the Mississippi River to the Pacific Ocean. What they found was not what they expected. The assumptions that had been made were not only wrong; it also meant that a brand new plan needed to be put into place.

Bolsinger uses this illustration to encourage leaders to practice *adaptive leadership*, the kind of leadership that's needed when the old, or technical ways, are no longer effective. (An easy example of adaptive leadership would be all the things we had to start doing differently when the pandemic happened.) While there are many steps to and aspects of adaptive leadership, the piece that I want to focus on today is what Bolsinger calls a "recommitment to your core identity." That's where our stories become important.

To carry forward into the future an organization needs to be clear about the things that are essential to its identity. Who are we, why do we exist? As a church, we might ask what are we called to do, what purposes and principles are central to our identity, or even, what must we let go of to continue our mission? Stories help us answer those questions. For example, our geographical location is important – charter members helped start a community with our unique Lutheran identity in North Mankato because of the way the community was growing, and many of our members still call North Mankato home. Another example – I've always thought that the design of this building says a lot about who we are – it's functional and flexible, having been used in a variety of ways over the years. Nothing ornate or pretentious here! A lot like the people of Messiah, a lot like how we functioned through the pandemic, a lot like how we might want to continue to function into the future. See what I mean? One more example: I've heard a lot about the connections that this place had with a Native American reservation for many years. Although we no longer travel to South Dakota, there remains a strong sense of helping others, and it shows up in everything from serving meals and volunteering at the shelter to starting a scholarship fund, quilting, winter clothing donations, anonymous financial assistance....you get the idea! Stories from the past tell us that helping others is important to us, and knowing that helps us think about our future priorities and actions.

As we celebrate our past and share our stories in the next few weeks, listen carefully to them. Ask yourself, what do they tell us about this place and who we are, and what do they tell us about our future? What kinds of stories do we hope the people of Messiah will be telling in 2072? Happy 50th!

2020 Roadmap Meeting Update

Council and congregational leaders met in June to formulate a “roadmap” of goals and action steps for the Messiah community to undertake over the next several months. The work is not yet finalized, with one more meeting scheduled. A complete summary of this work will be available later in July but in the meantime, we wanted to bring to everyone an overview of the work that has been done.

First, the values of the community, originally identified in early 2020, were updated and are now:

1. Deepen people’s relationships with God and learn to share the love of Jesus.
2. Build strong relationships with one another.
3. Be a positive force in the community.

We also updated Messiah’s strengths and aspirations, found reason to celebrate happenings from the pandemic years and identified the things that have changed since the first roadmap from 2020 was created. We will be interested in your feedback when the full report is published!

Perhaps most importantly, we identified and are working on finalizing four goals (actions) that we will be focused on in the coming months. These actions include:

- 1) a once a month “come to church early and bring our own coffee” time, complete with name tags so that we get to know each other better or get reacquainted;
- 2) holding a “Rally Sunday” in September to share the needs of the community and opportunities for involvement, including encouraging members to complete a “Gifts and Opportunities” inventory;
- 3) exploring ways to better connect with our on-line worshipping community and
- 4) developing a variety of opportunities that are focused on discovering and keeping “hope” in this new world we now inhabit.

Watch for the details to be finalized and shared soon, and be ready to help us achieve those goals.

CHURCH COUNCIL

June Meeting Highlights

- The council approved the May financials—our total income was \$21,189 and expenses were \$27,580 resulting in expenses over income of \$6,390. Year-to-date expenses are over income by \$15,529. The Messiah Council encourages members to note the current financial picture for the church, with TYD expenses outpacing income. We have had some increased expenses that are part of “returning to normal” and everyone is aware of inflationary issues. Members of the council want to thank you for your ongoing giving to this ministry, and to encourage your ongoing or additional gifts.
- Property Committee—Outdoor lights have been updated to LED with free lift up from the City of NM. Gazebo tarps have been put in place to reduce wind during outdoor worship. Residential dishwasher will be purchased with generous donations.
- Fellowship and Rec Committee—Fun Days planning is going well. Due to some supply chain issues, food has been ordered in advance.
- Church directory sign-up is up and running with hopes to get as many members signed up to get portraits.
- Decision to have Rally Sunday on September 11th—more specifics to come
- July Council meeting will be Sunday, July 10th after 10:00 am worship. There will be no meeting in August.
