

- Endowment-still gained on investments and disbursed for vbs, youth trip, bible study materials. Brochures available. Also on scholarship financially as submitted and pleased to present to 4 recipients. Have 1650 available for this year for requests.

Proposed budget as documented- 2023 under benevolence we have been giving to five places regularly for many years. We are under the impression we don't do a lot with some of them. Synod will get normal but the others may change with ideas for immigration family. Debbie noted that Lutheran campus ministry would make sense to support based on geographic location. Pastor Trish noted that we don't have a lot of kids go to camp anymore. We do use Green Lake for some day camps and retreats. Noted also the campus ministry is in a state of transition without a minister. Took out LSS last year though a strong non profit. MN River Conference have to give our dues. Synod missionary directed to immigration and largely appreciate their leadership with effort. We don't use Good Earth. (Dave Frye) Funds still there and wanting council discretion throughout the year to decide where they go. Family support still in early stages among five committed churches. We gave 3750 and other churches are giving in many ways. Noted that Good Earth attends to those in 50 mile radius. In February we will see the welcome team information on immigration family. Supporters welcomed monthly/regular basis.

Annual Report 2023

#### Kim Henrickson, Council President

Dear friends in Christ, I send you warmest greetings. 2023-a year of challenge and change, a year of celebration and service

Challenge-a winter with so much snow, a winter that never wanted to leave. All that snow created challenges on two levels. One, it made it difficult to attend worship in person and two, the church budget allotted for snow removal was based on an average year but 2023 was no average year. The expense far outpaced our budget putting a shortfall in our balance sheet that we're still battling as the year 2023 ends.

Celebration and service kicked off the summer with a new effort. HOPEning Weekend of Summer, June 2 -4, brought together not just the members of Messiah but also of our community. Picnic and music started the fun on Friday. Service Saturday featured a nature walk, clean up walk and bike ride. Sunday/ Sonday with the summer's first outdoor worship followed by ice cream treats was a hit too. In July members of Messiah joined to make the pie and brat stand at North Mankato Fun Days both fun and a good source of funds for the work of the church.

Challenge-the physical condition of our aging church building and property required action. A large project, the failing boiler was replaced. A number of the heating/cooling units in the office, classrooms, conference room and pastor's office, were not functioning and needed replacing. The challenges continue as we move into 2024. The furnace needs repair. The parking lots need resurfacing. And the windows/roof continues to leak water in the worship space. These repairs will require a commitment on the part of the people of Messiah.

Change-our much-revered reverend, Pastor Trish Reedstrom submitted her resignation in October of 2023. Steps were taken by the Council and the Synod to begin the process finding a new pastor to lead the flock at Messiah. Pastor Barb Streed from the Synod is guiding the process. She recommended the Council consider and interview Pastor Timothy McDermott to become our Intentional Interim Pastor. He was offered the position and accepted in November 2023 and is currently serving the congregation from both the pulpit and with his experience in this area, through the process of calling a new lead pastor for Messiah.

Celebration and service continue to thrive at Messiah. Our worships are celebrated and lead by dedicated, talented individuals who read, usher, sing, play music, prepare the altar and worship space, create and prepare the bulletins and more . The early and often the late services are shared on the Internet for those who cannot attend in person via Facebook Live. Multiple Bible studies are continually providing opportunities to learn and grow in our faith. Another book study group is meeting. And fellowship is happening in the Gathering Space, in coffee shops and restaurants around the area. Service may just be what defines Messiah and its mission "Sharing the Love of Jesus" best. The list is long and growing- we care for Creation, walking ditches. We care for our brothers and sisters of Messiah with visitation and prayer. We care for our community family with meals, clothing drives, food donations, school supplies, quilts and prayer shawls, the sharing tree, scholarship opportunities, community events.

We value our past here at Messiah but even more, we look ahead with hope, to what God has for us in the months and years to come. It has been an honor to serve as your Council President.

#### **Interim Pastor Tim McDermott**

Dear Partners in Christ:

I have written many Annual Reports (over 40!), but not one where my tenure with a congregation is six weeks! Until now. I can report that I am finding Messiah to be an engaged, hospitable, exciting community of faith. But six weeks is such a short time! So, I have decided to write my annual report from a future perspective; I will "report" on one possible future for Messiah Church and its ministry.

Imagine that it is 2027 or 2028. It's been four or more years since our newly called resident pastor has come to lead our congregation. What will our parish be like then?

Well, first and foremost, we will continue to be grateful that Covid 19 has much less of a hold on our personal, family, community, and congregational life than it did several years ago. Thanks be to God.

Furthermore, I can imagine a congregation that, under the leadership of our new pastor, has taken significant steps forward in its ministries. If I were to visit this future Messiah Lutheran, the first thing I would notice is the large number of children in our worship services, Sunday School, and Confirmation programs. I would sense the wonderful energy that a large number of middle and high school students can bring to a congregation. I would notice many new faces--people from our Mankato-North Mankato community--who gather for Sunday worship, weekday Christian education, frequent and meaningful fellowship activities, and much-needed service to our community within and beyond our walls.

I can imagine a parish united around a life-giving idea that we are committed to be a congregation that follows the leading of the Holy Spirit, builds people and families of faith, and actively shares the love of Jesus with all.

If I were to visit Messiah in a few years, I think I will encounter a committed group of disciples who have energetically answered the three key questions congregations face when calling a new pastor:

Who are we? Who is our neighbor? What is God calling us to be and to do?

Now, I admit that this "preferred future" represents my hopes and my prayers for you as we move forward in the Transition and Call process. You may envision a different future. You may have different priorities. You need to be heard. Your ideas about the future Messiah community are so important. This time between pastors calls for discernment, reflection, and willingness to allow God to reveal to us God's hopes and dreams for our community, as we move into God's preferred future.

So please, PLEASE respond generously to the opportunities you will be given to speak your hopes and dreams at the various activities the Transition Team will offer to the Messiah community in March and April of 2024. This work will not only provide the Call Committee (to be selected by the Messiah Church Council in April 2024) with a Ministry Site Profile that would-be pastors can study while considering a call to our parish, but it will also give you a chance to share where you believe God is leading us in the years to come.

I am so excited about the possibilities that await us. I am so grateful to be on this journey with you. I am blessed beyond imagination to serve you as your Interim Pastor. And I so look forward to visiting you in four or five years to see what you, with God's grace and guidance, become. You are a great congregation. Your voice needs to be heard now. We are entering a phase of discernment. Pray and participate in this time of imagining an exciting, grace-filled, God-led future. I hope that you will participate enthusiastically.

# MESSIAH LUTHERAN CHURCH Annual Report 2023 Lifelong Learning

**Mission:** Sharing the love of Jesus with people of God of all ages so that they are nurtured in faith, grow in knowledge and experience, and are inspired and empowered to live as disciples of Jesus Christ.

Supporting Scriptures: Philippians 3:10-14, Colossians 1:9-10, Ephesians 3:14-21, Matthew 28:16-20, 2 Timothy 1:3-7, Matthew 22: 37-39, Proverbs 22:6

#### <u>Birth – 3 yrs. Ministry:</u>

• Messiah welcomed two children into the Lord's family through baptism and each family was presented with a Bible for their child.

## Elementary Ministry:

- Four first Communion students and their parents attended a retreat on March 11, 2023 to explore the meaning of the sacrament, why we share this meal, and what is meant by "elements." The children received their 1st Communion on Palm Sunday (April 2, 2023).
- On October 8th, nine 3rd graders came forward with their families to receive bibles. Bibles were blessed and presented to each child during worship.
- The Sunday School children, pre-kindergarten to 5th grade, told the Christmas story titled on December 17th during 10am United Messiah United Service.

## Sunday School Ministry:

- Sunday School is a special way for children ages 3 years old through 5th grade to come together and experience God's love and hear God's Word through fun, hands-on lessons using methods that give the children opportunities to experience the Word of God through Bible stories, crafts, games and songs.
- Messiah continues to use the SPARK curriculum in a classroom setting instead of a rotational one. There are multiple activities done each week to "Spark" the children's hearts to learn more about God and to encourage them to get into God's Word via their SPARK Bibles. 41 children continued with Sunday School in the Spring of 2023, and 42 children were enrolled in Sunday School in September of 2023. We also are trying out a new curriculum titled "Whirl" with the 5th grade youth.

#### Vacation Bible School Outreach

Messiah Lutheran partnered with Christ the King & Epiphany Churches for Vacation Bible School.VBS sessions commenced from Monday to Thursday, June 19-22 12:30 - 5:00 pm each day. Approximately 5 children were a part of the week's activities, and several middle and high school students served as volunteers for part or all of the week.

#### Middle School Ministries (MSM):

- Our Wednesday night schedule includes a meal at 5:30 PM, worship at 6 PM and large and small group learning until 7:30 PM. Twenty-four 6th, 7th and 8th grade youth are attending MSM for the 2023-2024 school year. (7 in 6th grade, 12 in 7th grade and 5 in 8th grade)
- Twelve 8th graders affirmed their Faith during an Affirmation service on April 30, 2023.
- The 8th graders held their preparatory retreat for Affirmation of Baptism on Saturday February 25th at Gustavus Adolphus College.
- The 6th and 7th grade MSM students had their retreat at Green Lake on October 6-7 with staff from GLLM and Pastor Trish.

#### <u>High School</u>

- For the second year, in September, students participated in "Last Sunday Sessions" with Pastor Trish.
- High school youth participated in service projects including Christmas cookie baking for the Sunday School children's Christmas program, Kiwanis Lights, and College Care Packages, and social events at WOW Zone, Ski Day at Mount Kato and picnic.
- Middle and High School Summer "Service & Sun", July 10-12th, youth participated in service events and social activities, including going to Valley Fair on August 9th.
- High School students filled and sold treat-filled Easter Eggs on Palm Sunday to help fund youth events.

#### Adult Learning

- Adult Bible Study options include Wednesday mornings with the group watching a sermon from Lutheran Church of Hope followed by discussion; Thursday morning men's breakfast and lectionary discussion at Happy Chef; Thursday evenings video and discussion on various topics (Interpreting the mystery of Revelation).
- One small groups began meeting this fall, studying/discussing the book "Outlaw Christian".

Pastor Trish will be leaving as of October 31. We reviewed her letter to the church regarding her request for remaining PTO available. She was under the impression that she had 11 days, or 88 hours. It was determined that this was in error, and in fact she actually had 10 days. Correction will be made.

Greg reported that our interim Pastor, Tim McDermott, will begin this November 15. At a later date a transition team will be assembled to set up a ministerial profile.

In regards to our secretarial staff beginning in August Jan Waller reduced her workload from 40 hours/week to 30 and Amy Malvin increased her load from 25 to 35 hours /week. Secretary Jan Waller is phasing out at the end of December of this year. Date of her departure Is not set but will occur by November of 2024.

In regards to the personnel team, interim Pastor Tim will join replacing Pastor Trish. Sarah reminded the team that she is rotating off and thus a new secretary will need to be appointed. In the meantime, she will turn over the Personnel team notebook to the church office. Bill Halstead signed a confidentiality statement. Britta Peterson was absent and will also need to do so. Missy Stafford is no longer at Messiah so a new member will be appointed to replace her. Scott, Bill and Britta will continue.

#### During 2023 we did all of the usual projects:

- Sprayed the lawn for weeds.
- Fertilized the lawn.

- Did the annual mower maintenance and bought gas for mowing.

#### **Social Outreach**

Messiah's Social Ministry provides Messiah's members the opportunity to make a positive difference. Bringing compassion and helpfulness to individuals in our immediate and worldwide community.

#### 1. Social Outreach Team: Barb Meier, Cheryl Christofferson, Jan Waller, Lynn Klaber, Sandy Dahms

*"January Collections":* Starting the 8<sup>th</sup> of January, we collected items for the Connections Homeless Shelter and Partners for Housing. These items consisted of coffee, lemonade mix, paper towels, to-go cups, toilet paper, garbage Bags and monetary donations. You generously donated a dozen boxes of Items and \$180 in cash!

*"A Fresh Start" Collection:* In February, Amy Klugeritz, the founder of "Fresh Start" talked to the congregation about this new Non-Profit that provides new home essentials for those emerging from homelessness. Messiah collected a full pick-up load of quilts, blankets, household items and furniture for "Fresh Start", and was able to add several of our members as valued volunteers.

*"March Campaign":* Throughout the month of March, we participated in a food and monetary donation drive for ECHO food shelf with The Minnesota Food Share program. We collected goods, food, and monetary donations the entire month of March. You generously donated 2778 pounds of food and \$315 in cash!

"Share the Warmth": Messiah collected at least 161 items of warm clothing. This included coats, jackets, vests, snow pants, sweaters, sweatpants and shirts, caps, mittens, hats, gloves, boots, scarves for men, woman, and children. Recipients of the clothing were the Cruz family and the Salvation Army "Bundle Me Warm" program.

**"Fall Piano Concert Fundraiser":** 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Fundraiser for Messiah's Food Outreach Program. Special thank you to Cindy Rupp & Noah Wilson for volunteering their time and talents by providing beautiful piano music and a mini singalong. We had 105 people attend the concert followed by decadent dessert table and beverages. We were blessed to raise \$2,155.41 for our Food Outreach Program.

2. <u>Service Projects</u>: Pastor Trish Reedstrom, Social Outreach Team, Individual Messiah members

"FOCP-STOMP": Summertime Outreach Meal Program. Six days in June, July, and August.

twelve Messiah members drove to several locations in Mankato and delivered cold lunch meals for children.

*"God's Work, Our Hands" Day of Service Project,* Rally Sunday Kick off for SS: In August we asked the congregations help to collect and bring in items needed for "Blizzard Bags". Blizzard Bags are given to the Meals on Wheels recipients who are served by VINE Faith in Action and Lutheran Social Services. These bags are given out to recipients for a back-up meal when Volunteer Drivers cannot deliver due to extreme winter weather. On Sept. 10th, we gathered after worship for an all-congregation service project and packed over 200 "Blizzard Bags". Birthday cards for children who participate in Camp Noah were also made & decorated. Camp Noah is run by LSS and is a specially designed camping experience and curriculum for children who have experienced a disaster in their community.

Messiah members have donated \$14,778.43 toward the group's financial responsibly for the Cruz's.

As another year has drawn to a close, we give thanks for what has been and look forward with anticipation and hope.

In 2023, the ministry of the Southeastern Minnesota Synod continued in earnest. Sixty-two congregations engaged in the call process even as some continue their call process into the new year. We were delighted to welcome 21 new rostered ministers into various settings within the synod.

#### **PROGRAM REPORTS**

#### Lunch For-a-Buck

Five local ELCA congregations, Bethlehem, Christ the King, Epiphany (Eagle Lake), Grace, and Messiah (North Mankato) – along with their 40 volunteers – prepared, provided, and served lunch to Minnesota State University-Mankato students and faculty on 31 Tuesdays during Spring and Fall Terms in 2023. Crossroads Campus Ministry's Lunch For-a-Buck program saw increased numbers in 2023. A total of **1,430** individuals were served lunch while the volunteers also collected **\$1,365.77** in donations that were used to purchase salad supplies, beverages, and paperware. The numbers above represent a 57.5% increase in attendance and 44.5% increase in donations compared to 2022, when 909 individuals were served lunch, and \$945.12 in donations were collected.

Hunger and food insecurity are real on the campus of Minnesota State University-Mankato. We are grateful for our partnerships with area congregations who support the students and the ministry at Crossroads. We would not be able to feed the Lord's sheep without them.

#### Food Support - Campus Cupboard

Campus Cupboard food pantry provides food to any student with a current ID from MSU-Mankato, South Central College, or Bethany College. It is open Tuesdays, 11:00 AM to 3:00 PM and Thursdays, 12:00 PM to 5:30 PM. In an average month, the Cupboard serves 374 households and distributes 13,451 pounds of food.

- In the summer of 2023, we moved Campus Cupboard to the main level of the Crossroads building. Campus Cupboard is now housed in half of Crossroads' gathering area, which is an excellent use of space, allows us to serve more students at the same time, and offer a wider variety of products. We averaged 974 visits per month and gave away a total of 161,413 pounds of food. This is an increase from last year! We served students, their children and in some cases their parents.
- In addition to our regular visits, we co-hosted a Farmers Market each fall and spring semester with MNSU, where we distributed more than 4,000 pounds of produce to over 500 students in 3 hours.
- Much of the food was purchased from the Second Harvest Heartland food bank. We also participated in food rescue with Cub Foods West, who provided about 33% of the food we distributed without charge.
- We cannot express how great our appreciation is for the on-going support of civic groups. We were blessed to receive two nights of food donations from the Kiwanis Holiday Lights, totaling more than 1,300 pounds. And our heartfelt thanks to the SE MN synod, for your faithful support as well.
- We depend on grants and donations to do the work that we do. We appreciate your support!
