- A Message from LaDonna Thomas -

Dear Beloved People of Messiah,

If you've ever helped your parents or a sibling downsize their household or if you've had to clean out their house after their death, you know that you find all kinds of interesting things they have saved over the years. One thing that is sometimes found in a dusty box in the corner of the attic is a box of letters - love letters. They are from the days when your loved one was courting or being courted. Sometimes those relationships had to survive distances created by war, a job in another state, or attending college. From those letters, we learn a lot about the multi-dimensioned nature of their relationship. Those love letters kept the relationship alive and growing when the two could not be in each other's presence.

I like to think of the Bible as God's love letters to generations of people who have and continue to live in relationship with the Holy One. From the pages of Holy Scripture we learn how God's relationship with people and all of creation is sustained and grows over time. We hear again and again in a multitude of different ways the depth and breadth of God's love and grace. When we hear and study the stories that have formed the Judeo-Christian faith, God's story becomes our story.



Every time we gather for worship, we read from the Bible. We get to listen in on God's love letters to the world God created. What is read from the Bible in Lutheran worship is usually determined the Revised Common Lectionary (a schedule of readings), which was put together in the 1980's by a commission that included representatives from 20 main-line denominations. That lectionary has four assigned readings for each Sunday: a reading from the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament), a Psalm, a reading from a New Testament letter, and a reading from one of the Gospels.

One of the gifts of the common lectionary is people in main-line Christian churches all hear the same Scriptures from week to week. That means that you and your Methodist, Presbyterian, Episcopal and UCC friends are all hearing the same scriptures readings when you attend your individual churches each week. This has served to unify the Christian Church throughout the world.

One of the challenges of the common lectionary, though, is the connections between the four readings is not always obvious. And, sometimes, it seems as though we are hearing snippets of scriptures from here and there. What's often missing is the context of the readings and the thread the connects the scriptures together. And quite honestly, sometimes the readings are random and there is no thread that connected them.

About 15 years ago, a team of professors from Luther Seminary in St. Paul put together a new schedule of readings called The Narrative Lectionary. This four-year cycle of readings begins in September and continues through May of each year. Each year begins in the first book of the Bible, Genesis, and continues with one reading from the Hebrew Scriptures each week until Christmas. Then the weekly reading moves to one of the Gospels and follows the life of Christ.

One of the gifts of this new lectionary is that, over time, it allows hearers to get a sense of the bigger picture of the Bible and the thread of God's love and grace that holds all of it together. Biblical stories are presented in their larger context, which helps us understand and apply them to our lives. This new lectionary also allows us to take time to become more familiar with parts of the Bible we might not know as well - like the Hebrew Scriptures.

Our congregation council has decided to give this new lectionary a try, beginning on September 7th. One of the big changes you will notice is that the lectionary has only one reading for each Sunday (instead of four). And that reading will be a little bit longer than we may be used to, so that we can get a sense of its context. Our hope is that as we spend the year in this new lectionary, we might grow in our understanding of how the whole Bible fits together and how God's story is our story - a series of love letters from God.



COUNCIL UPDATES

2025 council members: Janet Jones, Nate Brekke, Jean Zandstra, Katie Hendrickson, Dustin Runkle, Swede Mundell, Julie Olsen and Greg Suskovic.

Our July tithes and offerings were down significantly from June, yet our income and expenses for the year are even. Income YTD 2025 is \$209,309 with expenses at \$209,343. Income YTD 2024 was \$190,330 vs. expenses of \$201,080. Therefore, our giving is \$19,000 above last year while expenses are \$8,000 higher. This is encouraging as we go through our summer slow time for giving and anticipate a wonderful fall season, and the generous response to our Capital Campaign.

Church Council met on July 23rd and the following was discussed:

- The Paving the Way campaign has raised over \$208,000 and is entering the implementation phase. Parking lots are scheduled for repair and seal coating in August, and skylight work is underway. HVAC installation is planned for the fall, ideally between seasonal temperature changes. Again, we are thankful for Messiah's commitment to this deferred maintenance project.
- On Sunday, September 28, we will celebrate God's Work Our Hands Sunday with a worships united service at 10:00 am, a blessing of school supplies, and a lunch to celebrate our capital campaign progress.
- Greg and Sarah Suskovic donated a portable speaker with two microphones, available for group use in the building and can be borrowed from the conference room.
- We still need musicians for Wednesday night worship this fall. If you know anyone with keyboard, guitar, or vocal skills, please contact Pastor LaDonna at the church office.
- Piano, Passion and More will be October 26, at 2:00 pm and help support our capital improvement fund.
- A Messiah constitution update is planned soon.
