- A Message from Pastor Trish -

You've probably heard the word "hope" at Messiah by now. We had "HopeComing" and "HopeSending" Sundays, and council leaders talked about "hope" as a theme when they discussed our roadmap goals for the coming months. This month, you are encouraged to sign up for an opportunity to meet with a small group once a month for 6 months to discuss what else? Hope. That's also the theme for the sermons every Sunday in October. More on that in a bit – first: why hope?

It was the theme that popped out at us earlier this summer when congregational leaders were gathering to discover a direction to take over the next several months (i.e. roadmap). As we talked about all the changes of the last 2+ years and how it's affected us as individuals and as a community, and as we pondered what we needed during this time of continued uncertainty, the need to be people of hope rose to the top. Leaders recognized that it is increasingly difficult not to succumb to the despair, anxiety and antagonism that is so prevalent these days. There was agreement that what we needed was the ability to hope and believe that things will get better. And what better place to talk about, look for and discover hope than the church?

But understand: real hope isn't "if I just wish hard enough (or work hard enough) things will be OK". That's a myth that doesn't serve any of us very well. Instead, hope is about refusing to yield to the darkness; it's about believing things will get better even while being realistic about the time if will take for that to happen. Hope is about deciding to look for the light in the darkness itself; it's being intentional about seeing the hidden signs that are all around us. Most of all, hope is about believing that the One who created us and saved us is with us in the misery, and hope is about sharing that understanding with one another when we all struggle with hopelessness.

Which brings me to our Sunday worship services in October. Each week, we will focus on a quality of hope: faith, blessing, persistence, community, action. I'm relying heavily on a book I discovered this summer: "Ladder to the Light: an Indigenous Elder's Meditations on Hope and Courage". The author is Steven Charleston, and he's a member of the Choctaw Nation as well as an Episcopal bishop, seminary professor and dean. I expect I'll be sharing a number of quotes with you from his book, which uses the Native American vision of a "kiva" as a metaphor for climbing up and out of the darkness into light. Bishop Charleston writes that the kiva is a sacred space of darkness (think of a womb) where we all begin. It's also a place of "spiritual resilience", a place of formation and growth. In that place we learn, understand and mature until we are ready to climb the "ladder to the light" and take our place in the reality of the world around us. But that metaphor won't be the focus for our worship services. Instead, I discovered that each of our gospel readings for the month will allow us to focus on a particular rung of this ladder that he writes about, and that's where we'll get our qualities of hope. Come and hear some of the very familiar stories about and parables of Jesus found in Luke 17-19 while we explore qualities of hope, and encourage each other to live as people of hope. See you in church! (And sign up for that small group!)

This event is sponsored by the Mankato Area Lifelong Learners. All are welcome.


Harvest Hope Dinner & Classical Piano Concert

Small Group Study Opportunity—Hope: A User's Manual



Small groups are an opportunity to connect with others and grow in faith and hope in a smaller setting. It's an opportunity to not just grow in your own faith, but to grow in community with others as well. Small groups are currently forming, and will hopefully start meeting in November. Each small group is asked to meet once a month for 6 months, at a location of their own choosing, including an option to meet at Messiah. Groups can meet in person or on-line, so don't let your location or travel plans stop you from joining. A sign-up sheet is located in the narthex, or call the office to sign-up.

What will happen in the groups? Discussion will focus on the book "Hope: A User's Manual" by MaryAnn McKibbon Dana. Each of the six chapters are composed of several small (1-2 pages) reflections, followed by a discussion question or two.

CHURCH COUNCIL

September Highlights

The council discussed communication re: the 2022 budget of \$345,000 for 2022. As we head into the last quarter of the fiscal year, expenses are in-line with expectations. (Expenses through 8-30-22 are at \$231,345.) That's the good news! The not-so-good news is that income is also below budget. As of 8-30-22 income was at \$206,308, resulting in a YTD difference between income and expense of \$25,036. We hope and trust that all the activities, education, support, and relationships that the Messiah community fosters is important to you, your family and your community. Leaders also hope you will respond by reviewing your own offerings to the ministry so far this year, and then giving from your heart, recognizing that such giving is a big part of what it means to love each other. Please share your questions and concerns with council members. Thank you for all the ways you already share your time and your treasures with this ministry, and please prayerfully consider your gifts to Messiah for this last quarter of the year.


