Re-organization of our food ministry has begun as of January 1st. After much consideration and prayer about how Messiah serves Crossroads and Connections we have decided to make some changes.

Crossroads will remain the same – as least through April, changes may happen starting in September. Our next serve date is, Tuesday, January 16th. Sign-up sheets will be available on January 7th.

Connections: We are encouraging members of our congregation to form Serving Groups. Ask your friends, relatives, neighbors to join you in providing a meal for 40 people and serving, once a season or more. Messiah has (2) active Serving Groups currently. You would sign up on-line through the Connections Website on the date of your choosing. There will be assistance available for sign-up, organizing, funds for purchasing food, preparing, and serving if needed. Please contact Barb Meier or the Church Office with questions or interest.

We will continue to serve Connections as a whole congregation 1x monthly instead of 2x monthly. Our next date is Monday, January 29th and sign-up Sheets will be available on Sunday, January 14th. - A Message from Interim Pastor Tim McDermott -

Dear Partners,

As I begin my third month among you as an Intentional Interim Pastor, I want to share with you an outline of our work together in the next six to nine months.

The first three months of a Transitional Pastor's (another name of an Intentional Interim Pastor) time are spent getting to know the congregation, learning its history, offering grief support to those who mourn the loss of the previous pastor (in our case, Pastor Trish), leading at worship, presiding at the Sacraments, visiting the hospitalized, sick, and homebound, and assisting families who have suffered the loss of a loved one.

During these early months the Transitional Pastor begins to develop a list of members who will be asked to serve on the Transition Team. This team, to be approved by the Church Council on February 11th, will have responsibility for producing the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) that will be sent to all pastors and recent seminary graduates who might be interested in serving at Messiah.

The Transition Team will participate with other congregation members and members of the Church Council at the Purpose and Guiding Principles Retreat on February 24th. Then, for a couple of months following that date, the Transition Team will provide opportunities for all our members to offer insights about our congregation, to present hopes and dreams for our future ministry, and to suggest changes in focus that make sense for our Christian community. The public phase of the Transition Team's work is completed on April 21st.

I cannot emphasize enough that the goal of these two+ months of work is to identify your insights, your hopes, and your dreams for our congregation, which is to say, the Transition Team decides very little but rather assists the congregation in determining and articulating the best path forward for this great and storied ministry called Messiah Lutheran Church.

From late-April to mid-May, the Transition Team will compile and interpret the data you offered and put it into the Synod-sponsored Ministry Site Profile (a congregation's resume if you will). On May 19th, Pastor Barb Streed of the Southeastern Minnesota Synod will be with us to present the MSP to the Messiah community and ask for the affirmation of the congregation.

While the congregation is doing its work under the leadership of the Transition Team, the Church Council (during March and April 2024) will be soliciting potential candidates for the Messiah Lutheran Church Call Committee. The final slate of names will be approved by the Church Council on May 12, 2024. After having been trained by Pastor Streed, the Call Committee will begin its work. First, names of pastoral candidates will be given to the Call Committee by Pastor Streed (May/June). Then, the Call Committee will choose candidates to interview in June/July. Second interviews with very promising candidates will be held in July/August. Assuming the Call Committee finds the right candidate for Messiah Lutheran, a Call Meeting of the congregation will be called in late August or early September of 2024. If the candidate called by our congregation accepts the call, he or she could arrive as early as September or October of 2024. At that point Messiah Lutheran Church will have a new pastor and I will move on.

Please contact Messiah's President (Kim Henrickson) or me if you have names to suggest for members to serve on either the Transition Team or the Call Committee.

It is my privilege and delight to lead you through this process. Please pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit as we gear up to find, call, and receive Messiah's new resident (settled) pastor.

This will be the second year in which the congregation of Messiah will be giving a scholarship to any member of the congregation attending post-secondary education. Please remember, scholarships are not just for our high school seniors — anyone attending or planning to attend a post-secondary institution in 2024 is eligible. The scholarship is a \$250 award, renewable for up to four years/\$1000 total.

REQUIREMENTS FOR FIRST YEAR RECIPIENTS

- Must be a confirmed member of Messiah Lutheran Church.
- Have completed 25 hours of volunteer work in the church or community. See list of approved activities.
- Be attending an accredited college, university, or technical college.

REQUIREMENTS FOR SECOND YEAR RECIPIENTS

Write a 250-500 statement highlighting what you like about Messiah Lutheran Church and any suggestions on how to make the church experience more rewarding.

PROCESS

- Submit application & volunteer form or essay by March 1, 2024 to the office or a member of the Scholarship Committee.
- Notification of awards will be by May 1, 2024.
- Recognition of awards will be on Graduation Recognition Sunday.
- Scholarship is distributed after successful completion of the fall semester at the approved post-secondary institution. Submit unofficial transcript by December 31, 2024.

COUNCIL UPDATES

Stewardship & Finance: As of November 30, we slipped to 86% of budget compared to 91% of the last 2 years' average. Expenses are now \$25,015 above income. We ask that you catch up on your planned giving or prayerfully consider helping Messiah make up our year-to-date deficit. We thank you in advance.

Our 2024 pledges now total \$245,358 compared to \$251,519 last year. It is through your continuing gifts and pledges that our church, Messiah, can continue its many ministries. And for that we are grateful.

We can't believe that we're already at the end of Fall Term at MSU-Mankato! We are beyond blessed to have Messiah Lutheran Church and your volunteers as partners in our ministry to feed the Lord's sheep through our Lunch For-a-Buck program. We were pleased to welcome your volunteers on three separate Tuesdays during Fall Term when they fed a total of 154 people while collecting \$136.01 in donations. In all, five area ELCA congregations combined to serve Lunch For-a-Buck on 15 Tuesdays during the term, feeding a total of 828 people and collecting \$820.84 in donations. This is a substantial increase over 2022, when 448 individuals were served lunch during Fall Term and \$514.81 in donations was collected.


