Dear Beloved People of Messiah,

A few years ago I met for the first time the folks who are now my daughters in-laws. We all met for brunch at a farm-to-table restaurant in Duluth. I was living in Pennsylvania at the time and was in Minnesota for my daughter's college graduation.

If you've ever been part of that kind of "meet and greet," you know it can be a little awkward. It takes a while to warm up to one another and find the mutual interests and the shared conversation, beyond the weather and how my trip from Pennsylvania was. What really broke the ice was when they offered me a small gift bag that contained a bag of wild rice they had harvested themselves from the boundary waters near their house and a bottle of maple syrup, which they had tapped and boiled themselves from trees on their property. I learned as much about these future in-laws from their gifts as I did from our conversation. Their hospitality gifts certainly reflected Minnesota culture and they reflected their deep connection to the land, water, and produce of north shore, where they live. They respectfully and with honor and grace harvested what the land and waters offered and received it as gift for the nourishment of their bodies - which they graciously passed on to me.

I don't know that I would have ever sought out wild rice as an addition to my own diet or ever felt a necessity to have home-made maple syrup. But once I tasted it and enjoyed it in recipe after recipe, I began to feel a deeper connection to the folks who shared it with me.

I wonder if that experience or maybe one like it that you have had could serve as a template for our upcoming Lenten spiritual practice of coming together in Sundays in one service (at 9:30 a.m.) instead of two. Our worship committee floated this idea over a couple of Sundays last month. Just as many people take on a spiritual practice or discipline for the season of Lent, we wondered how our worship life would be richly served if we practiced coming together for the six Sundays in lent.

A surprising number of you who responded to the "straw poll" (93%) indicated you would support this practice for a season, then returning to two services on Easter Sunday. This is much more than just our occasional "worships united" Sundays in which we have tried to accommodate the worship styles of each service. In this uniting for one service for successive weeks, let's wonder what we can learn from each other about worship of God. We'll have an opportunity to learn a bit about what makes worship "Lutheran." And, maybe, just maybe we'll receive some gifts from one another that really help us know one another better and build our sense of being community together. We learned through last summer's capital campaign theme that building community is one of our core values around which we focus our time and energy as a congregation.

For those who indicated in our "straw poll" that they would not support this one service practice for Lent, I hope that you might reconsider, given that such a large number are able to support it. If you chose not to be present for all of Lent, we will certainly miss you and grieve your absence. I know that for some, there may be health, family or other logistical issues that make the 9:30 time not feasible. If that is you, we can connect with you in some other way like through our FaceBook live or YouTube recordings or our Wednesday evening service? And, please feel free to speak to me personally if you'd like to explore other possibilities.

Let's all mark our calendars on February 22, March 1, 8, 15, 22, and 29 for one worship at 9:30 a.m. Together we are kindling generosity, building community, and transforming the world.



Council Updates

2025 council members: Janet Jones, Nate Brekke, Jean Zandstra, Katie Hendrickson, Dustin Runkle, Swede Mundell, Julie Olsen and Greg Suskovic.

December offerings were \$43,001 vs expenses of \$33,425. This resulted in a surplus of \$9,576 for the month. Total income for 2025 is \$351,352 with expenses at \$363,831 or a shortfall of \$12,479. Total income for 2024 was \$334,227 vs. expenses of \$362,069 which left us with a \$14,842 deficit.

Therefore, our giving is \$4,125 greater than last year while expenses are \$1,762 higher. Happy New Year!

Church Council met on January 11th and the following was discussed:

- Correction - The previously mentioned Fourth Quarter local benevolences (Connections, Salvation Army, Echo Food Shelf) are actually the First Quarter local benevolences for 2026.
- The 2026 budget approved and endorsed by the Congregation Council in December, includes a stipend for a youth director. We are hoping to move forward with growth in our programming for our youth.
- The Congregation Council approve a minor change in Messiah's Gift Policy.
- The Congregation Council approved and endorsed changes to the Messiah Constitution. This draft document will be sent to the synod for approval and then brought to the congregation for approval. This draft brings our constitution more in line with the format of the ELCA Model Constitution. There are also updates in several areas (participating in sacraments, endowment disbursements, and adding the pastor as a voting member of the Congregation Council). Watch for further information about this.
- We should be moving to Thompson Sanitation for trash removal and recycling. Some paperwork needs to be completed.
- The date to install the 2026 council will be Sunday, February 8.
